## **JOB SUMMARY:**

Performs a variety of tasks at a skilled level in the operations and maintenance of the District's two wastewater treatment facilities. Operate hand/power tools, equipment, and machinery to accomplish assigned duties such as, but not limited to; data collection, water quality monitoring/treatment and sampling, process control work, grounds/building maintenance, piping/valve/pump repairs, and other overall preventive and corrective maintenance duties within the facilities.

Work is generally performed under general supervision.

## **ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:**

- Maintains regular, predictable attendance.
- Physical ability to conform with all safety requirements.
- Observes facility for proper functioning of mechanical processes. Informs management of potentially hazardous conditions or problems in all areas of responsibility.
- May troubleshoot a variety of treatment plant related problems in areas of assignment.
- Accountable for the proper execution of procedures, to ensure efficient and reliable operation of all District equipment and processes.
- Accountable for collecting and recording accurate operational and performance data for assigned work.
- Appropriately document tasks performed.
- As assigned, performs treatment plant preventative and corrective maintenance such as but not limited to; cleaning, scraping and painting machinery, equipment and facilities; Repairing or replacing valves, switches, motors and related equipment; Removing debris from bar screen; Cleaning structures, equipment and flow units; Operating grit removal system; while performing basic site maintenance and custodial duties as assigned.
- Familiar with SCADA systems, gauges, meters and control panels.
- May make adjustments to equipment within established guidelines.
- Exercises good judgment and decisions within the scope of each assignment.
- May train assigned staff on operation, maintenance, and equipment use in area assigned.
- As directed, collects influent and effluent samples; Trains in routine process control lab testing and reports findings.

- Notifies supervisor of any problems or safety hazards identified in the course of the work shift.
- Monitors and complies with all safety measures and procedures at all times.
- Available for on-call duty and after hour emergencies.
- Requires shift, weekend and holiday work.
- Must be able to get to district boundary from residence in 30 minutes for on-call rotation.

### **ADDITIONAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

#### **EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:**

- High School diploma or equivalent.
- One (1) year operational experience in a Class II or higher rated secondary treatment facility OR two (2) years of experience in a similar work situation OR any combination of education and experience, which demonstrates competency.
- Must possess a valid Washington State "Group I-OIT" Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator certification, or have established reciprocity at time of appointment.
- Must obtain within one (1) year from initial employment, any required certifications or licenses applicable to the utility; i.e., First Aid Training, Certified Flagging Safety, etc.

#### **KNOWLEDGE SKILLS AND ABILITIES:**

- Working knowledge of activated sludge including the types and uses of processes and standard equipment used in the operation of a wastewater treatment plant.
- Requires working knowledge of electricity.
- Ability to maintain accurate records.
- Ability to read and understand basic as-built drawings.
- Competency with the types and uses of common hand tools, electrical and/or mechanical and standard equipment used in operation and maintenance work.
- General mechanical aptitude and ability to perform semi-skilled tasks without close supervision.
- Familiarized with the District's CMMS program.
- Ability to operate plant equipment and pumps.
- Understands and follows job procedures, rules and safety.
- Requires intermediate knowledge and understanding of wastewater related mathematics.
- Familiar with spreadsheet software for recording and analyzing data.
- Familiar with basic chemistry, laboratory procedures, sampling procedures, and instruments used in environmental analysis.

#### **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:**

- Ability to communicate courteously, effectively, tactfully, and maintain confidentiality.
- Demonstrate good written and oral communications skills.
- Ability to carry out oral and written instructions.
- Ability to organize and prioritize workload.
- May perform task/job duties of other work unit positions in order to balance workload and/or cross train personnel.
- Proficiency with common office practices, equipment and software.
- Follow all safety requirements set forth by District policy, State and Federal codes.
- Follow all District Policies and Procedures.
- Other duties as assigned.

#### **SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:**

- Must have valid WA State Driver's license.

- Requires a Class A Commercial Drivers License (CDL) and additional endorsements (tanker and air brake) within eighteen (18) months of training start date.

**WORK ENVIRONMENT:**

- Work is generally performed in a plant environment.
- May require shift, weekend and holiday work as required by emergency or work assignment.
- Anticipated to respond in emergency situations.
- Work is generally performed in an environment consisting of loud noises, biological agents, chemical hazards, and odors associated with wastewater treatment plants.
- Ability to work in or around confined space areas.
- Ability to perform manual tasks involving physical strength and endurance.
- Requires visual and hearing acuity and substantial manual dexterity.
- Ability to withstand exposure to variable weather conditions.

**MACHINERY, TOOLS, EQUIPMENT, PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT:**

- Equipment utilized includes laboratory equipment; miscellaneous hand and power operated tools and equipment associated with treatment plant maintenance and repair; vehicles including small and full size pick-up trucks, forklift, and standard office equipment including a computer.
- Personal Protective equipment (PPE's) shall be comprised of all PPE's associated with chemical, confined spaces, and atmospheric conditions common in the work place. Level of PPE protection will be determined by District and safety guidelines.
- Able to wear and use a respirator (tight fitting negative and positive pressure type).
